

















The Geopolitics of Sub-Saharan Africa course uses the Geopolitics analysis tool - space as a theater of operations - to understand Sub-Saharan Africa today. With a multidisciplinary approach, the course covers key issues of geopolitical activity in the region, presented by specialists in the subjects.

General objetives:

- Identify key geopolitical issues in Sub-Saharan Africa.
- Reflect on key dimensions of geopolitical action, namely those related to domestic and international politics, the environment, issues of war and peace, and multilateral security organizations.
- Highlight relevant cases of Portuguese-speaking African Countries.
- Understand the processes in a regional way, involving several States, about dynamics in the South Atlantic, Gulf of Guinea, and Horn of Africa.

Duration: 20h (+130h autonomous work + 12h tutorials for the 6 ECTS).

Tuition Fee: 50€ (25€ for students and staff of the institutions involved in the scientific committee and Portuguese public entities).
